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Words Beginning with RE-

The prefix re- means 'again'.

1. **reapply (verb)** – to ask for something again; to put in application again. *The man was going to reapply for his old job in the shop.*
2. **reconsider (verb)** – to think about something again, possibly to decide something different. *Children need to reconsider whether or not it is a good idea to bring electronics to school after an I-pad was broken.*
3. **rearrange (verb)** – to arrange in a different order. *The boy rearranged the flowers in the vase.*
4. **reaction (noun)** – something done in response to something else. *If you hit someone, they may have a bad reaction to you.*
5. **reform (verb)** – to make changes to something to make it better. *We need to reform the club rules so that will not happen again.*
6. **rebound (verb)** – to bounce back after hitting something hard. *The ball hit the wall and rebounded across the pavement.*
7. **refurnish (verb)** – to change the furniture in a room. *Their living room was recently refurnished.*
8. **reassess (verb)** – to think about something again when you learn something new about it. *We have decided to reassess how we are teaching maths.*
9. **reassemble (verb)** – to put something together again. *He had to reassemble the desk after he moved it to his new flat.*

Words Beginning with PRE-

The prefix pre- means 'before'.

1. **prediction (noun)** – something one says will happen in the future. *After reading part of his book, she made the prediction that the boy would capture the dragon.*
2. **precaution (noun)** – something that is done to prevent something bad from happening. *We moved everything breakable out of the room as a precaution before the baby arrived.*
3. **preoccupied (verb)** – to have something take up all of your thoughts so you can't think of anything else. *The new mum was preoccupied with making sure her baby was safe and comfortable.*
4. **prehistoric (adjective)** – a time before people started writing down what happened. *Some people lived in caves in prehistoric times.*
5. **prevent (verb)** – to stop something before it happens. *We must prevent him from going to the beach.*
6. **preview (verb/noun)** – a chance to see something before most people can get see it. *He was able to preview the movie because he belonged to a cinema club.*
7. **previous (adjective)** – the one before. *I liked the previous book I read better than this one.*
